

This certificate program includes 14 self-led, online courses with assignments to provide foundational training for residency faculty. Completion requires a minimum of 35 hours and covers:

This yearlong fellowship offers training and mentorship for early- and mid-career underrepresented in medicine (URM) and Asian American faculty.

Early-career fellows will:

- Develop scholarship writing skills for academic advancement and leadership
- Learn how to recognize, navigate, and overcome the minority tax
- Create a research question tailored to their specific academic responsibilities
- Identify opportunities from scholarship both within and outside of their institution
- Write and publish a letter to the editor as part of a small group
- Write and submit at least one manuscript with the coaching and co-authorship of faculty and peer mentors

Mid-career fellows will:

- Receive one-on-one mentorship specific to their challenges or roadblocks to promotion or leadership
- Participate in a detailed CV review to determine edits for promotion
- Work as a group and with mentor faculty on challenges in scholarship to move forward with stuck projects
- Learn how to navigate midcareer leadership challenges


